## History is right in our backyard!

There are many events planned this summer at the Saratoga Battlefield. This is a great way to spend some time with your family and bring your children to this historic site.

Events include:

- Ranger-guided evening bike tours — enjoy scenic views in American and British fortified areas of the park with staff and volunteer guides. Rides usually cover 5 miles. Please bring water and insect repellent. Helmets required. Wednesdays, July 20, August 3 and 17, 6-8 p.m.
- Children's program series at Schuyler House. Children ages 5-12 enjoy different 18th century activities each week such as playing games, dressing up in colonial clothes, cooking and dancing. Thursdays, July 14, 21, and 28, 1-3 p.m.
- Guided Early Morning History Walks. Join volunteer guides on a series of walks. Programs will alternate daily. Participants should be able to walk 2 miles over uneven ground and should bring water and insect repellent. Wednesdays, July 13 and 20; Fridays, August 5, 12, and 26, 9 a.m.-11 a.m.
  - July 13 – September 19: The First Battle
  - July 20 – October 7: The Second Battle
  - August 5 – Why Saratoga?
  - August 12 – September 19: The First Battle
  - August 26 – October 7: The Second Battle

- August Music Series – Music echoes through the Hudson River Valley. Bring a bag lunch and enjoy the views while listening to noontime concerts every Tuesday, noon-1 p.m. August 2, 9, 16, and 23.
